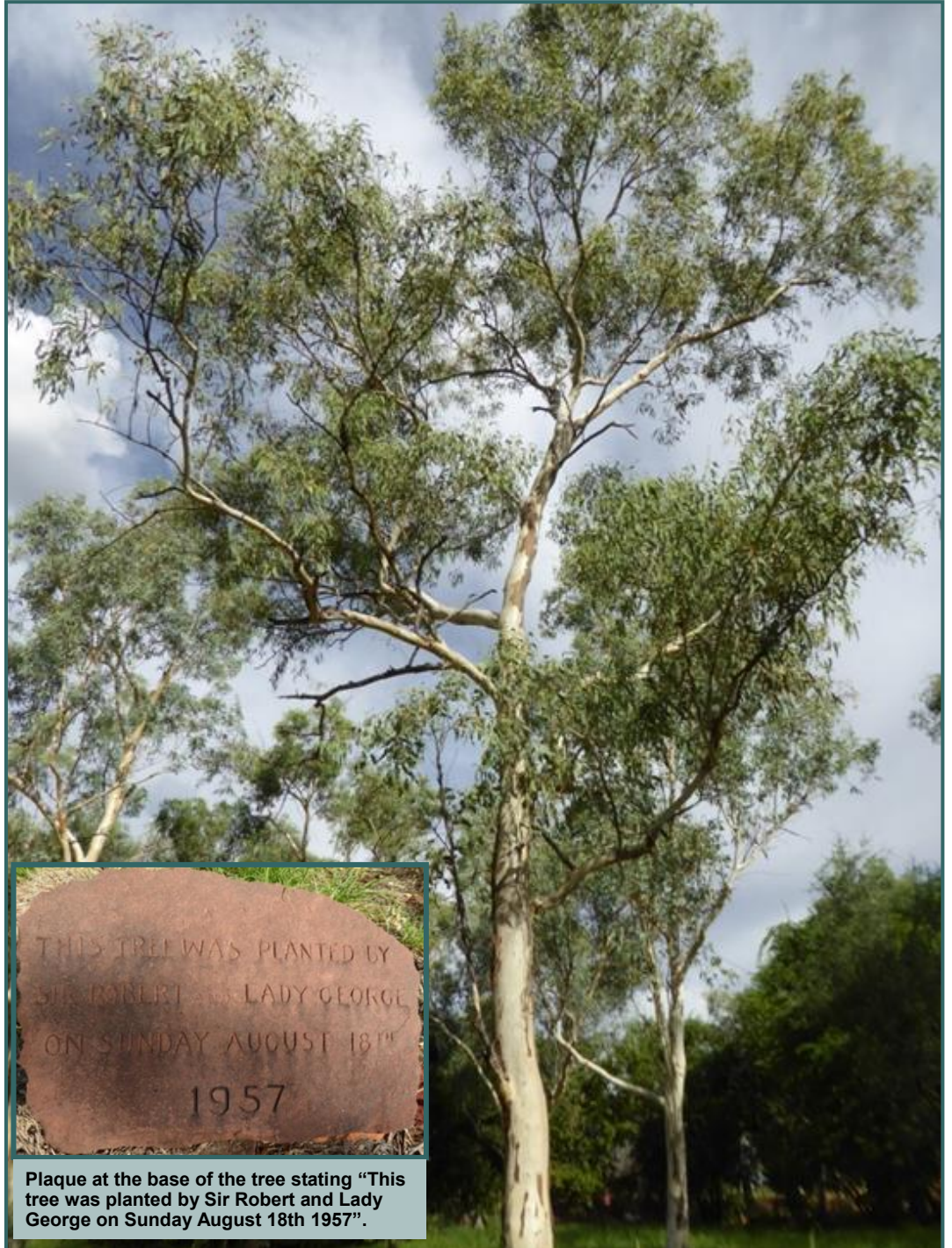

This tree is situated in the heritage-listed Pitchi Richi Heritage Sanctuary, located approximately 4 km south of the Alice Springs town centre on Palm Circuit. The sanctuary was established in the early 1950's by Leo Corbet, who is considered by many as one of Central Australia's earliest conservationists. The sanctuary is currently closed to the public, however this tree can be viewed from the river side of Palm Circuit opposite the Heavitree Gap hotel entrance. There is a Plaque at the base of the tree stating "This tree was planted by Sir Robert and Lady George on Sunday August 18th 1957".
