

This spectacular Ghost Gum specimen is listed in both the Northern Territory Register of Significant Trees and the National Register of Big Trees as the largest Ghost Gum in the country. It has been measured at 33 meters tall and is estimated at over 300 years old. Situated in the Trephina Gorge Nature Park, the tree is protected by the Northern Territory Parks and Wildlife regulations. It can be found by following the main access road from the Ross Highway through to Trephina Gorge, turning right half a Kilometer past the John Hayes Rock Hole turn-off.
