The original Jacaranda trees in Alice Springs originated from the yard of the Johannsen family's house on Todd Street (now Todd Mall), opposite Adelaide House. They were planted by Ottilie Johannsen. The Jacarandas in front of Adelaide House, and reportedly all other Jacarandas in the region, were grown from seeds taken from the Johannsen's tree. The earliest record of these three specimens is a photo taken in 1938-39. Jacarandas were widely planted as shade trees in Alice Springs from the 1940's and these fine examples create welcome shade in the Todd Mall. Unfortunately, after wild storms in 2016, these trees had to be heavily pruned due to hail damage.
