

The largest Tamarind (S.W corner) was probably planted 1944-47 while others were

planted when the bodies of U.S troops were exhumed between 1947-51, and sent back to America. These particular Tamarinds stand behind a cross effigy on the northern boundary of the cemetery.

Whilst the Americans were 'housed' in the cemetery it extended further north and there are still some bodies (believed to be three) that could not be found and rest on the other side of these Tamarinds.
