An interesting group of trees as they are the only ones of their kind in the immediate area. The surrounding countryside is made up of open *Eucalyptus* forest. The Tamarind is included on the register due to its impressive size, it is the tallest specimen in the Darwin Peninsula. In India a yellow dye is extracted from the feathery blue-green leaves. The pale yellow flowers, produced at the beginning of the wet season, have a delicate perfume that is strongest in the evenings.
